The mapping and other land use research involved in the creation of the Erieto-Pittsburgh Trail is made possible through the use of ArcView GIS, a software package from Environmental Systems Research Institute (ESRI). Local and statewide data used in these projects was provided by Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR), county GIS departments and/or county Conservation Districts.
